The garbage trucks, followed by the delivery trucks, cause most of the wear and tear on the roads. If every resident on any given road was to use the same garbage company that would save the largest portion of the road deterioration resulting in less potholes & repairs needed.

In the winter, your neighbors plow the unincorporated roads. It takes a commitment of equipment, gas and time. Please help them out with a thank you and financially.

FIRES: Fires on the Algonquin Hills picnic lot are no longer allowed due to Village of Algonquin laws.

RIVERFRONT: Docks on Algonquin Hills property require \$500 annual rental & certificate of insurance.

DUES: Annual dues of \$40.00 are due the 1st of the year. Your dues help maintain the community property including the picnic lot.

BOATS: We are working on launch improvements! The entry into the water has deteriorated; We are looking to repair the water entry. You must be a paid Algonquin Hills member to purchase a boat launch key. The fee for a key to the boat launch ramp is only \$35 for the season.
